Aktion Club Week is the first full week of March

Aktion Clubs can participate in a week designated to shine the light on the impact you're making in your communities. Follow a special theme each day during the week to build awareness and engage new members. This easy-to-use toolkit can help you make the most of Aktion Club Week by using the templates provided and adding your own club's story.

The toolkit includes:

- A media release and letter to the editor. These explain what Aktion Club is and have room for you to highlight your club's service projects. The tools include media pitches inviting reporters to cover your club's events.
- Graphics and suggested social media posts for your Aktion Club and your Kiwanis club to share on Facebook, Twitter, and Instagram.
- Sample proclamations by city, county and state government boards and commissions.

Local service club allows adults of all abilities to contribute to the community

The Aktion Club program began in 1987. Today, more than 550 clubs further the Kiwanis International mission of serving the children of the world.

Clubs often provide help in communities where budgets have been cut or social services have been reduced. Each Kiwanis club determines the best way to meet the needs of the community. Some give students backpacks with school supplies; others provide gifts and meals during the holidays or organize bike and swimming safety lessons. To provide these services, clubs raise funds through a wide range of activities ranging from selling peanuts and holding pancake breakfasts to sponsoring car washes and dances.

In addition to sponsoring Aktion Clubs, Kiwanis clubs promote youth service leadership programs by sponsoring K-Kids clubs for elementary school students, Builders Clubs for middle school students, Key Clubs for high school students and Circle K International for college students. These clubs are all dedicated to making their communities a better place to live and work.

Aktion Club provides a safe place for members to interact while working on projects that benefit others.

SOCIAL MEDIA

Let your club and community know what Aktion Club is and what it's doing. Use the daily theme information and graphics at <u>https://www.aktionclub.org/grouping/aktion-club-week/</u> to create social media posts.

Examples:

Monday: Show your K in every way. Take and post a photo of Aktion Club members wearing logo items such as T-shirts, hats or pins. Add a caption about your members' proud participation in Aktion Club Week, and list any planned service projects.

Tuesday: **Kudos to Aktion.** This day honors members for their work. Post a photo of your appreciation party or members receiving certificates or awards.

Wednesday: **Dare to Care.** Photograph and post pictures of a service project and be sure to include other participating charities or partners. If your club holds a service project, share photos of members working. If your club presents its activities to your sponsoring Kiwanis club, share a photo taken during the meeting, noting that Aktion Club members also help the community.

Thursday: **Kindness in Aktion.** Challenge members to complete a random act of kindness; then, share their efforts on social media. Little things mean a lot. Holding the door for someone, letting another person go ahead in line or leaving change in a vending machine all contribute to kindness. Share these ideas via social media.

Friday: **Connect the K's.** Celebrate with other Kiwanis-sponsored clubs and photograph your members having a great time, whether at a social event or a service project. Show your Kiwanis-family clubs in action.

PROCLAMATIONS

Many governing bodies such as town boards, city councils, county boards of supervisors, or commissioners, set aside time during meetings to issue proclamations. Mayors and city or town supervisors also issue proclamations. Most ask the requesting organization to provide a template with specific information.

Call your mayor's office or local governing board to determine if they can issue a proclamation and how much advance time is needed. In both your request and the proclamation, itself, be certain to note any projects the club has performed with or for the city or county. Use the template below, modifying as necessary, to highlight your club's projects and events.

Invite members of your Aktion Club and sponsoring Kiwanis club, along with any partners, to the meeting when the proclamation will be given. You also can notify media about the photo opportunity; include information about past or future service projects or events that are worthy of coverage. Make sure your club takes photos and shares them on social media and your website.
